

June Hopkins

Dr. June Hopkins was initiated in 1973, a charter member. She was the 1992 Chapter Women of Distinction.

She served as the Monroe County Intermediate School District Assistant Superintendent.

Eleanor Russell

Eleanor was initiated in 1973, a charter member. She was an active member of her chapter for 50 years. She served as the President of the chapter from 1978 to 1980 and again from 1994 to 1996. She was the chapter Women of Distinction in 1985 and 2002. Along with this she was Chairperson of Personal Growth and Services. Lastly, she helped serve lunch at Holiday Camp. Eleanor was an elementary teacher for Monroe Public Schools for 25 years, utilizing the bachelor's and master's degrees in education she earned from Eastern Michigan University.

Her love for her community extended beyond education. Eleanor stayed active by volunteering for over 25 years with Mobile Meals where she served as the director and driver. She also volunteered with the Salvation Army, Monroe Council of Churches, and Church Women United.

Eleanor received numerous awards including a Distinguished Service Award from the Michigan Association of Retired School Personnel, the Wilfred E. Simpson "Church Person of the Year" Award by the Monroe Council of Churches, and the Michigan Week "Minute Man" Award.

As a long-standing member of Christ Lutheran Church, Eleanor served in numerous roles including church council Vice President, Sunday School teacher, and VBS Director. For many years she oversaw funeral luncheons, Easter and pancake breakfasts and Lenten suppers. In recognition of her dedication and service, the church honored her in 2014 by naming the fellowship hall after her. Eleanor will be missed by her family and friends.
